The focus of the artist's work is primarily on the subjects of nature, and she tries to change our familiar ways of looking at a natural element, to draw attention to unknown phenomena or invisible processes in nature or simply change our way of looking at things.

Mycorrhiza Explosions (Mycorrhiza black and white) - The artist has recently dealt intensively with the topic of mycorrhizal fungi. The mycorrhizal fungal threads, which perform a very important ecological task in the hidden soil and are mostly invisible to us, are made visible.

In this day and age, when a lot is being destroyed on our planet, painting is one of the ways to make people aware of the perfection, fragility and importance of intact nature.
